



**The walk through this former quarry is about half a mile, but with a peaceful path through lush woodland and wildlife ponds it had to be included. For just over a mile do two loops or turn back at the top pond for just under.**

### **Getting here:**

There is a small dedicated free car park at the end of Osborne Road, off Crowborough Hill. TN6 2HN.

Buses 224, 225 and 228 stop at Medway on Crowborough Hill 400m away. Crowborough railway station via Crowborough Hill and Osborne Road is 850m away.

The walking surface is compacted large stones which uneven in places and may have muddy puddles. Exceeds 10% in lots of places with the steepest slope being 20%. No steps or stiles. The gate at the beginning of the walk is wider than one metre. Choice of two gates at the end of the walk, one 3m wide, the other is 60cm wide and easier to open. Suitable for some off-road wheelchairs. Suitable for pushchairs, though it may be bumpy for standard buggies. Lots of seats. No shelter. No toilets, shops or refreshments. The walk is fully waymarked, follow the green arrow posts.



**1** Head through the gate at the far end of the car park. Pass the information board, cross the bridge and follow the green arrow posts around the walk.



**2** Stay on the main path at the sign to the pond and head uphill.

**3** Turn left by the information board.

**4** Stay on the main path and ignore all paths to the right.

**5** At the pond stay on the path to the car park to walk half a mile or turn around and retrace your steps for a mile.

**Caution:** steep drops behind the fence to the left of the path in places.



**Distance:** 0.55 miles (870m) or 0.95 miles (1.5km) if turning at the top pond.

**Ascent:** 32 metres (105 feet) or 48 metres (157 feet).
